Homework expectations



Part 1) Rationale for homework

- Homework is defined as anything that students do outside the normal school day, in response to guidance from the school, which contributes to their learning.
- Homework is an important part of education: it helps students to develop effective work habits, and allows consolidation of skills and knowledge learnt in school.
- Homework often plays a significant role in raising a pupil's level of attainment.
- However, we also acknowledge the importance of family time and leisure time in ensuring students are able to achieve balance and wellbeing in their lives.

Part 2) The aims and objectives of homework

- To retrieve and consolidate learning from the lesson.
- To develop skills and attitudes they need for successful lifelong learning, including independence, investigation, enquiry, organisation, perseverance and self discipline.
- To maximise student attainment

What homework is

- planned in advance and part of a sequenced curriculum
- purposeful
- adapted to the needs of students with SEND
- clearly explained to students
- marked/self marked/acknowledged/given feedback in some format.
- appropriate to the learning/subject/key stage
- clear and achievable

What homework is not....

- randomly set
- set just for the sake of it
- last minute
- finishing off work
- asking students to teach themselves something
- forgotten about
- unmarked or unacknowledged
- so complex that students cannot complete it independently
- generating cost to the student/family through printing, buying items, making things and needing special equipment

Part 3) Types of homework

- Retrieval quizzes
- Comprehension activities
- Revision (explicit tasks, not general revision)
- Research
- Preparation of presentations
- Extended writing, problem solving
- Reading
